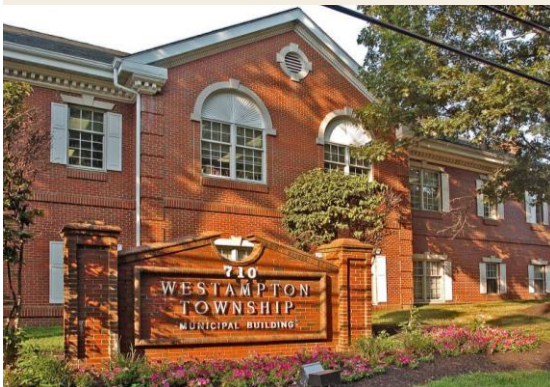

Dear township residents,

My name is Shaun Welthy and currently I am employed by the Westampton Township Police Department as a Patrolman. My interest in Law Enforcement actually started from an incident I was personally involved in. As a juvenile, I made a huge error in judgement and allowed "friends" to influence me. This action led to me having contact with the Willingboro Police. I was escorted to the station and the interaction with officers was enough to reshape my future. Afterwards, I found programs like the Burlington City Police Explorers Program that gave me an insight into police work.



I grew up in Willingboro Township and attended Burlington County Institute of Technology (Westampton Campus), where I graduated in 1998. In 2006, I applied as a Special Officer Class II with the Sea Isle City Police Department. I attended the Cape May County Police Academy and continued with the Sea Isle City Police Department until September 2006. In October 2006, I continued my career as a Special Officer II with the Mount Holly Police Department and a part-time officer with the Burlington County Bridge Commission. In March 2007, I was hired by the Westampton Police Department as a Special Officer II until being accepted as a full-time officer in November 2007. As a patrol officer, I worked a variety of shifts, received various types of training and continued to learn from experienced officers.

In early 2010, I applied and was awarded the opportunity to become a K9 officer for the department. I partnered with K9 Robi and we became certified in narcotics and patrol work after graduating from the Philadelphia Police Canine Academy. K9 Robi and I worked together for 8 years, thereafter he retired and became a full-time member of my family. During my time as a K9 officer, I performed numerous demonstrations with K9 Robi, especially for students of all ages, township residents at National Night Out, and special programs. K9 Robi loved to perform and was very social. I enjoyed seeing the happiness on the faces of children when they would watch K9 Robi play with a toy or run over to them for attention. Once I retired K9 Robi and moved back into the role of Patrolman, where I became certified as a Firearms Instructor, Taser Instructor and assist in the Field Training Program.

When I am not working, I routinely exercise and spend as much time as I can with my family. I reside by the shore, so a lot of my time during the summer I go the beach, fish with my son, and play basketball. I hope to make a positive impact on the residents of Westampton Township, as well as the others around me.

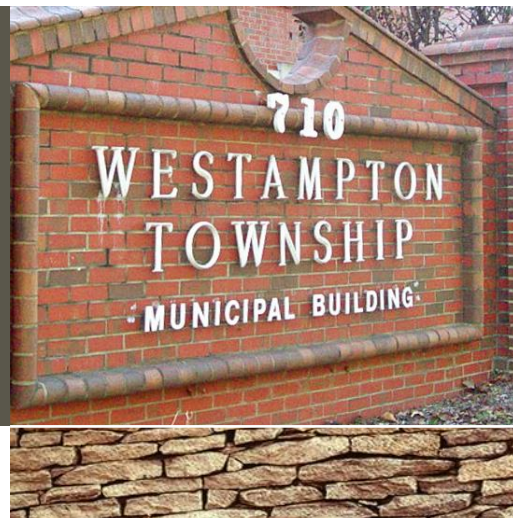
