



## News Around the Block!

Summer is here! What's not to love about Summer? Barbecues, ballgames, outdoor concerts, fireworks, beach trips, vacations, or just staying at home and relaxing! Summer unfortunately brings health hazards such as insect bites, sunburns, heat exhaustion and heat stroke. For your safety, please take the necessary precautions to avoid heat exhaustion and sunburns by applying sunscreen with at least SPF 30, taking frequent breaks and drinking plenty of water, protecting yourself from ticks and mosquito-borne diseases by using repellants, and limit outdoor activities during the hottest times of the day. This also applies for the safety of your family pets.

Regarding Home Safety — recently their was a home intrusion and home burglary in our community. Please make sure that all your doors and windows are lock at all times, don't leave your garage door(s) open and unattended, turn on all exterior lights at night, turn on your security alarm when away and sleeping. Make sure your vehicle(s) doors are locked and remove all valuables. Be vigilant! If you notice a suspicious person or vehicle in the neighborhood, immediately call 911 and take a picture of the person or vehicle along with the license plate using your phone camera if possible. These pictures can be very important and helpful to the police if a crime was committed in the community. If you are a victim of crime, please notify Tina Johnson @ APM so that an notification could go out to warn the community. It's Better to be Safe then Sorry!

### **SUMMER SAVINGS TIP**

### Learn how you can save water and money this summer

All across the country, water conservation is more important than ever. As temperatures increase, so does our water use, especially outdoors. You can take simple steps to save water and money this summer.

Water use spikes in the summer –we use two to four times as much when weather is warmer. Adjust your watering to make the most out of the water you use.

Here are some ways to improve your yard and use less water:

- Water in the early morning or evening to limit evaporation.
- Watch what you watering. Check sprinkler heads to make sure they're not wasting water on paved or unwanted areas.
- Avoid overwatering. Water for no more than 15-20 minutes per station per day and for only three days a week at most.
- Use drip systems for plants, flowers and older trees.
- If rain is in the forecast, turn your sprinkler system off ahead of time.
- Add mulch around plants and trees to help retain moisture.
- Use a smart controller that will adjust your watering automatically depending on the weather.
- Due a periodic check for leaks and breaks.
